Literacy

This term we will continue to focus on the 6+1 writing traits when writing a narrative, a persuasive piece and an information report.

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Numeracy

We continue to use a hands on approach to mathematics through the Top10 program. During the term we will explore addition, subtraction, money and time.

Students may move to a different classroom for maths this term as we begin ability-based maths groups. Year 2 students will now have more opportunities to be supported or extended in their learning of different math concepts. So far, we can see how beneficial this is for the students.

Inquiry

In inquiry this term Year 2 will begin with a focus on geography. Students will explore Australia's location in the world as well as famous Australian places and their local community.

Next will be a science unit, 'Living things change'. This will teach students characteristics of living things, as well as different life cycles. During this unit we will visit

Healesville sanctuary to participate in a day that explores animals' features, habitats, lifecycles, and what they need to survive.
