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


HIVE CORE VALUES

These are the four words we live by in the Hive. All students have been introduced to, or reminded of, the behaviour system that runs throughout the 5/6 area. Each student's behaviour is directly linked to the Friday electives. Each Friday afternoon students have a choice of fun activities. Students who have been on the behaviour system during the week accumulate consequences starting with the loss of their choice and increasing to the complete loss of their time. We are encouraging students to see the connection between their choices throughout the week in the classroom and playground and the ability to participate in weekly rewards.

MATHS

This year the Year 6 students will continue to learn mathematical concepts following the 5e pedagogical model. This model provides students with hands-on learning tasks and helps them in better applying the explicit skills taught. We have found our students are gaining a much stronger understanding of numeracy in the world and have improved their ability to connect mathematical concepts through highly engaging activities. This term our students are learning number and place value which they are applying in real-life situations involving measurement, money and number properties. Students participate in targeted Maths groups on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday along with a real-life Maths component with their own class.



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ENGLISH

Writing- All of our writing topics for the year are integrated into our Inquiry learning to better help our students understand the purpose and structure of different writing genres. For the first term, we will be working on our writer's notebook along with focusing on persuasive writing and narrative writing.

Jolly Grammar- This year we will be continuing with the Jolly Grammar program in the year 6 unit. Many of you will recall your children establishing a strong understanding of the letter-sound relationship through the stables of the strong transfer of the strong

you will recall your children establishing a strong understanding of the letter-sound relationship through the Jolly Phonics program. (You may still have some of the songs stuck in your heads!) With the success this program has had in improving literacy in the junior school, we have chosen to continue with the advanced program. This program will fully support improving our students' understanding of spelling and grammar strategies needed to be effective written communicators.

Reading- Our focus will be on the CAFÉ reading program in conjunction with the 12 comprehension strategies. Students will be learning strategies to assist them in comprehending the text, improving their accuracy, fluency and expanding their vocabulary.

Speaking and Listening- Throughout the week the teachers in The Hive run class culture sessions. These sessions include a range of circle time activities as well as discussions exploring our personal, social and ethical capabilities. Through these sessions, students develop the oral language skills needed to express themselves and articulate their opinions respectfully. We also assist students in developing presenting skills through our student-run 5/6 assemblies where students take responsibility for planning, preparing and running a performance for the rest of the students on a Friday.
